c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

CMS is a management tool system used for tracking, resolving, and reporting on military (active/reserve/retired) and vendor pay related cases or inquiries. Army and Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) Customer Care Centers (CCC) which are comprised of Military Pay (MilPay) and Commercial Pay (ComPay) use this information system. Army CMS users are located at various locations in the United States and outside the continental United States. DFAS CCCs are primarily located at Cleveland, OH; Indianapolis, IN; Columbus, OH; and Rome, NY.

CMS case management provides a single source of information for monitoring military pay problems in a timely and efficient manner, to include providing visibility to appropriate levels of management, permitting feedback to service members, and facilitating the identification of problem trends.

CCCs use CMS for tracking active/retired military and vendor customer inquiries through to their resolution. Occasionally, the inquiries will require research within the Department of Defense (DoD) Component and other DoD Components, as noted in section h. below, that use the Social Security Number (SSN) as unique identifiers.

The Army utilizes CMS as an all services, fully-integrated, single-source system for monitoring pay problems, uploading and tracking cases at all levels, providing immediate feedback to service members, monitoring timeliness, efficiency, and identification of problem trends.

The Personally Identifiable Information (PII) in this system consists of birth date, child information, citizenship, disability information, DoD Identification (ID) number, driver's license, education information, employment information, financial information, gender/gender identification, home/cell phone, legal status, mailing/home address, marital status, medical information, military records, mother's middle/maiden name, name(s), official duty address, official duty telephone phone, other ID number, personal e-mail address, photo, place of birth, position/title, race/ethnicity, rank/grade, security information, SSN (full or in any form), work e-mail address, and spouse information.

Overall the CMS does not collect PII directly from the individual. The Army receives PII concerning their work through an automated process. The CCC is the only user within CMS that requests PII from the callers to start a request. If a caller objects to giving their SSN then the Customer Service Representative (CSR) either logs the call under a miscellaneous tracking number or ends the call. In most cases, the CSR uses the SSN to accurately retrieve data from various other systems.

The CCC source of PII data is directly from the individuals themselves – either through telephone conversations, emails, or faxes from the customer.
