c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The Integrated Automated Travel System (IATS) is an automated travel entitlement computation system used by travel office personnel to compute travel entitlements for both military and civilian travelers. IATS computes a variety of travel claims such as temporary duty, permanent change of station, local travel, non-combatant evacuation and personally procured moves in accordance with the Joint Travel Regulations (JTR) and Federal Travel Regulations (FTR). Travelers submit travel claims on DD Form 1351, 1351-2, or 1705 and attach substantiating documents such as travel authorizations (e.g., DD Form 1610 or DD Form 1614), Direct Deposit Form (SF 1199A), and miscellaneous receipts (e.g., lodging and/or rental car). These forms can contain the following Personally Identifiable Information (PII): birth date, child information, financial information, home/cell phone, mailing/home address, marital status, name(s), official duty address, official duty telephone phone, personal e-mail address, position/title, rank/grade, Social Security Number (SSN), and work e-mail address. The PII is collected and input to locally maintained Travel Operations Office IATS databases.

d. Why is the PII collected and/or what is the intended use of the PII? (e.g., verification, identification, authentication, data matching, mission-related use, administrative use)

PII is collected to enable accurate processing of travel claims. The data identifies the individuals and is vital to proper calculation of travel entitlements. PII is also collected to support mission-related and administrative uses such as disbursing and accounting.

IATS does not collect PII directly from individuals. The collection forms used by the individual Travel Operations Office requires the PII. The IATS system receives the PII collected and requires the data for processing the travel claim.

The IATS office located at DFAS-IN is only a test and development Program Management Office (PMO) and stores only fabricated test data. PSC is the developer for the IATS application and each user site runs/hosts/operates the production environment. According to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) government analyst, the responsibility for the data falls with the agency collecting the data, therefore no OMB Control Number is required for the PMO. The data/information owner clears the data at the point of collection, thereby making it the responsibility of each production site to acquire and maintain their own OMB Control Number.
