Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) Tactical Process Analysis Tool (DTPAT) is an automated reconciliation and reporting tool based on Audit Command Language (ACL). DTPAT receives monthly process-to-process data sets, executes reconciliations using the scripted ACL logic, and then provides data reporting to DFAS users and customers. The system uses data results to ensure mandated audit readiness goals set by the Department of Defense (DoD). DTPAT does not collect Personally Identifiable Information (PII) directly from individuals. DTPAT reconciliation input data sets may contain PII data such as DOD Identification (ID) number, name(s), and Social Security Number (SSN). However, DTPAT does not act upon PII that may be contained in customer source files.

d. Why is the PII collected and/or what is the intended use of the PII? (e.g., verification, identification, authentication, data matching, mission-related use, administrative use)

PII may be utilized by source data sets (e.g., United States Air Force (USAF) and their support personnel) to identify, verify, and authenticate personnel to ensure proper payments were made. In such cases, PII is for administrative use only.
